To facilitate access and visualization of information related to the degradation of forests, deforestation and fires for socio-environmental territories.






Database

- Areas of Interest, a set of protected areas or other territories, which will be monitored by the tool.

- New features based on user consultation










Guaranteed sustainable business in the Amazon that value people and the standing forest

 - Conservation








How does it works?





Results and impacts



2021

- Presence in 38 protected areas in 5 large territories
- 52 millions ha of standing forest
- 1.940 registered producers
- 61 support institutions and member-organizations

Xingu territory



2020

- 591 registered producers from traditional communities and 11 ethnicities of Indigenous people
- 33 products
- 17 support institutions and member-organizations
- Presence in 13 protected areas representing 61,7% of total area of Xingu territory
- 17,5 millions ha of standing forest

Brazil nuts, natural rubber, copaiba, cumaru, honey, pequi, pepper, babaçu, Kayapó crafts and paintings, Menire/ Xikrin art, Xipaya crafts

- Making commercial relations official through contracts or agreements
- Low supply compared to demand Poorly structured sociobio value chains.
- Current model of financial support of Origens Brasil®

Progress

- Increasing offers from top 5 chains
- Expanding the network by engaging new members (companies, local organizations and producers)
- Becoming an activator of the network (enhancing exchange, cooperation and learning among members)
- Diversifying sources of income
- Having a financial support model that leads to autonomy.
